SEALED BIDS for COMMUTER TERMINAL UPGRADES, KONA
INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AT KEAHOLE, KAILUA-KONA, HAWAII, STATE
PROJECT NO. CH2621-63 will be received at the Contracts Office, Department of
Transportation, 869 Punchbowl Street, Honolulu, Hawaii 96813 or at the Office of the District
Engineer – Hawaii, 50 Makaala Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720, until 2:00 P.M., Hawaii Standard
Time (HST), June 14, 2016, at which time and place(s) they will be publicly opened and read.
Bids received after the said due date and time shall not be considered.

The scope of work consists of the removal of the two (2) existing modular trailers at
the Kona International Airport Commuter Terminal. The work also consists of the furnishing
and installation of two (2) new modular trailers at the Kona International Airport Commuter
Terminal, including all related work as called for in the plans and specifications in place,
complete, and ready for use. The estimated construction cost is between \$350,000 and
\$400,000.

A compact disc containing the plans, specifications, proposal and contract forms may
be obtained from the above office. Bids (hard copies) shall be submitted in a clearly
identified sealed envelope, and shall be on the Proposal Form provided on the compact disc
furnished by the DOT. The “General Provisions” applicable to this project are also available
for viewing on the internet at <http://hidot.hawaii.gov/administration/con/>.

To be eligible for award, bidders must possess a valid State of Hawaii General
Building “B” license at the time of bidding.

The Hawaii Products Preference pursuant to Act 175, SLH 2009, is applicable to this project. Persons wishing to certify and qualify a product as a Hawaii Product shall submit a Certification for Hawaii Product Preference (SPO- Form 38) to the DOT Contracts office no later than 4:30 P.M., fourteen (14) calendar days prior to the bid opening date. Late submittals for this project will not be reviewed by the DOT. A separate SPO-Form 38 shall be completed and submitted for each product. A 5% bid adjustment for bidders that are parties to apprenticeship agreements pursuant to Section 103-55.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), is applicable to this project.

Compliance with Act 192, SLH 2011 is a requirement for bids exceeding \$50,000.00 whereby a minimum of 80% of the bidder's work force on this project **must** consist of Hawaii residents.

Campaign contributions by State and County Contractors. Contractors are hereby notified of the applicability of Section 11-355, HRS, which states that campaign contributions are prohibited from specified State or county government contractors during the term of the contract if the contractors are paid with funds appropriated by a legislative body. 
The Equal Employment Opportunity Regulations of the Secretary of Labor implementing Executive Order 11246, as amended, shall be complied with on this project.
